

"Is Anything Too Hard for the LORD?"

9/29/24 Text: Genesis 18:1-15

I. The hospitality of Abraham (vs. 1-8) A. Abraham worked swiftly.

B. Abraham was prepared to serve.

C. Abraham demonstrated humility.

II. The promise of offspring (vs. 9-15)

A. Sarah will give birth to a son (Gen. 15:4; 17:16, 19). Genesis 18:9-10 - Then they said to him, "Where is Sarah your wife?" So he said, "Here, in the tent." ¹⁰ And He said, "I will certainly return to you according to the time of life, and behold, Sarah your wife shall have a son." (Sarah was listening in the tent door which was behind him.)

B. Sarah laughs at the announcement.

Genesis 18:11-12 - Now Abraham and Sarah were old, well advanced in age; and Sarah had passed the age of childbearing. ¹² Therefore Sarah laughed within herself, saying, "After I have grown old, shall I have pleasure, my lord being old also?"

C. Nothing is too hard (lit. "wonderful") for the LORD. Genesis 18:13-15 - And the LORD said to Abraham, "Why did Sarah laugh, saying, 'Shall I surely bear a child, since I am old?'¹⁴ Is anything too hard for the LORD? At the appointed time I will return to you, according to the time of life, and Sarah shall have a son." ¹⁵ But Sarah denied it, saying, "I did not laugh," for she was afraid. And He said, "No, but you did laugh!"

III. Application.

A. We all can learn and grow in the school of faith. Hebrews 11:11 - By faith Sarah herself also received strength to conceive seed, and she bore a child when she was past the age, because she judged Him faithful who had promised.

Mark 9:23-24 - Jesus said to him, "If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes."

²⁴ Immediately the father of the child cried out and said with tears, "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!"

B. God can perform worders beyond our comprehension. Ephesians 3:20-21 - Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us, ²¹ to Him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen.

Genesis 15:1 - After these things the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, saying, "Do not be afraid, Abram. I am your shield, your exceedingly great reward."
