

"Painful Providence: When God's Plan is Not What We Expected"

2/16/25 Text: Genesis 29:1-30

Main Idea: God's Providence is always at work in our journey, using seasons of waiting, disappointment, and even deception to shape us for His greater purpose—one that far exceeds our own plans and preferences.

1. God's Providence in our Journey (vs. 1-14).

Q. What do you understand by the providence of God?

A. Providence is the almighty and ever present power of God by which he upholds, as with his hand, heaven and earth and all creatures, and so rules them that leaf and blade, rain and drought, fruitful and lean years, food and drink, health and sickness, prosperity and poverty—all things, in fact, come to us not by chance but from his fatherly hand (Heidelberg Catechism Q/A 27).

2. The Perseverance of Love when Waiting (vs. 15-20).

[20] So Jacob served seven years for Rachel, and they seemed to him but a few days because of the love he had for her.

3. The Pain of Deception and Disappointment (vs. 21-27).

[25] And in the morning, behold, it was Leah! And Jacob said to Laban, "What is this you have done to me? Did I not serve with you for Rachel? Why then have you deceived me?"

4. God's Plan is Greater than our Preferences (vs. 28-30).
