

## "The Suffering Savior" Sunday, December 3, 2023 | Text: Matthew 27:27-44

## I. The Savior is mocked

Matthew 27:27-31 - Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the Praetorium and gathered the whole garrison around Him. <sup>28</sup> And they stripped Him and put a scarlet robe on Him. <sup>29</sup> When they had twisted a crown of thorns, they put it on His head, and a reed in His right hand. And they bowed the knee before Him and mocked Him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" <sup>30</sup> Then they spat on Him, and took the reed and struck Him on the head. <sup>31</sup> And when they had mocked Him, they took the robe off Him, put His own clothes on Him, and led Him away to be crucified.

## II. The Savior fulfills Scripture (Ps. 69:21; Ps. 22:18; Isa. 53:12)

Matthew 27:32-38 - Now as they came out, they found a man of Cyrene, Simon by name. Him they compelled to bear His cross. <sup>33</sup> And when they had come to a place called Golgotha, that is to say, Place of a Skull, <sup>34</sup> they gave Him sour wine mingled with gall to drink. But when He had tasted it, He would not drink.

<sup>35</sup> Then they crucified Him, and divided His garments, casting lots, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet:

"They divided My garments among them,

And for My clothing they cast lots."

<sup>36</sup> Sitting down, they kept watch over Him there. <sup>37</sup> And they put up over His head the accusation written against Him:

THIS IS JESUS THE KING OF THE JEWS.

<sup>38</sup> Then two robbers were crucified with Him, one on the right and another on the left.

## III. The Savior's strength

Matthew 27:39-44 - And those who passed by blasphemed Him, wagging their heads <sup>40</sup> and saying, "You who destroy the temple and build it in three days, save Yourself! If You are the Son of God, come down from the cross."

<sup>41</sup> Likewise the chief priests also, mocking with the scribes and elders, said, <sup>42</sup> "He saved others; Himself He cannot save. If He is the King of Israel, let Him now come down from the cross, and we will believe Him. <sup>43</sup> He trusted in God; let Him deliver Him now if He will have Him; for He said, 'I am the Son of God.'"

<sup>44</sup> Even the robbers who were crucified with Him reviled Him with the same thing.
