"Waiting on the Lord"

I. Waiting to reach land (vs. 1-5)

A. God remembers Noah (Gen. 30:22; Ex. 2:24; Luke 1:72-73)

B. The waters stopped and receded (Gen. 8:2-3)

C. The ark rested on the mountains of Ararat (Gen. 8:4-5)

II. Waiting for the birds (vs. 6-12)

A. Raven and dove find no resting place (Gen 8:6-9)

B. Dove finds a freshly plucked olive leaf (Gen. 8:10-11)

C. Dove does not return (Gen. 8:12)

III. Waiting to leave the ark (vs. 13-19)

A. The earth is dry (Gen. 8:13-14; Gen. 7:11)

B. Noah, his family, and the animals leave the ark (Gen. 8:15-19)

IV. Waiting leads to worship (vs. 20-22)

A. Noah builds an altar and offers burnt offerings (Gen. 8:20)

B. God accepts Noah's offering (Gen. 8:21a; Lev. 1:8-9)

C. God waits to judge evil (Gen. 8:21b; 2 Pet. 3:3-7; Rev. 20:12)

D. God promises to sustain mankind (Gen. 8:22)

V. Application

A. We actively wait with faith (Ps. 25:1-3; 62:5-8; Lam. 3:25)

B. We actively wait with patience (Ps. 27:14; Hab. 2:3)

C. We actively wait with obedience (Ps. 37:9, 34)

D. We actively wait with confident expectation (Ps. 40:1-3; 130:5; Is. 25:9; Heb. 11:13-16)

Psalm 27:14 - Wait on the Lord; Be of good courage, And He shall strengthen your heart; Wait, I say, on the Lord!
